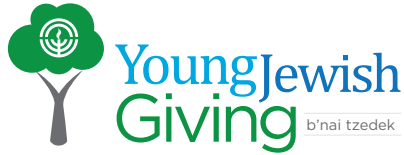

FAQs

When are applications due?

Applications for the 2018/19 YJG Teen Foundation board are **due August 26, 2019 by 5pm.**

Applications will be reviewed by Jewish Federation staff. Acceptance notification emails will be sent August 30, 2019.

Which ages/grades can apply to join?

Teens entering 9th-12th grades are welcome to apply.

What is the time commitment to be a Teen Foundation (TF) board member?

The YJG Teen Foundation board includes six Sunday board meetings and the annual Giving Shuk where the grant checks will be distributed. All dates and times listed on the 1st page. Board members must commit to attending at least five of the six meetings in order to vote on the final allocation of funds and to be considered in good standing for participation the following year.

How long can I serve?

Once you have been accepted to the board you are guaranteed a spot for the following year as long as you have fulfilled the attendance, participation and RSVP requirements. If eligible, you will be invited back April 27, 2020 and must accept or lose your guaranteed spot by April 29, 2020 at 5pm. If you are eligible but do not respond to save your spot by April 29 at 5pm you are able to apply again in August. There are limited spots on the board.

What is the financial commitment for TF Board members?

There is no financial commitment to be a member of the Teen Foundation board. However, you must have a Young Jewish Giving account to be accepted to the board. 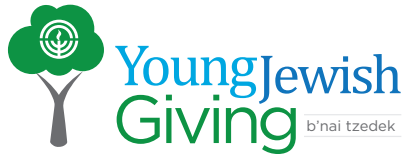
What will I learn by being on the TF Board?

- Nonprofit Research
- Public Speaking
- Consensus Decision-Making
- Grant making
- Assessing community needs
- Strengthening teamwork and leadership skills
- Conducting interviews with potential recipients
- Debating societal issues with peers
- Challenging your perspective and learning from peers
- Meeting other Jewish teens!

How long has it been around?

Entering its 3rd year. Grants made for 2018-2019:

- \$2000 to Child Saving Institute for a therapist in the emergency shelter or at-risk youth
- \$1750 to Meyer Foundation for Disabilities to underwrite a yoga program for adults with disabilities
- \$1000 to Ezras Nashim to support the efforts to provide dignified emergency care for women, provided by women for observant Jews in Brooklyn, NY
- \$1000 to HETRA to underwrite the cost of a therapy horse
- \$250 to Jewish Family Service to underwrite counseling sessions



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Participants are required to attend 5 of 6 meetings from September to March in order to vote on fund allocation and be considered in good standing for another year of eligibility on the board. Meetings will be Sundays from 12:30-2pm unless noted otherwise with Kosher lunch provided. The February 9 and March 22 meetings may last longer depending on how many interviews the board elects to conduct. Service hours will be given for attending each meeting and other work done outside of our scheduled meetings. Attendance at the Giving Shuk is mandatory.
